Age 35. Husband of Mary Beardsworth, 3 Wimberly Street, Blackburn.

Le Tréport is a small seaport in the Department of the Seine-Maritime, 25 km north-east of Dieppe and the cemetery is 1.5 km south of the town.

Go towards the centre of Le Tréport and then follow the Littoral / Dieppe sign. The cemetery stands on the right of a fork road on the D940.

Note 1:- John Beardsworth had served in the South African War (Ref: C.W.G.C.).

Note 2:- Since he is buried in a Le Tréport cemetery, this means, presumably, that he died in a Base Hospital there.
